

Introduction

Welcome to a fun and active way to explore the food system!

These Future Green interactive games turn sustainability into play - whether you're shouting out actions, racing to pillars, drawing your food vision, or hunting for real-world examples.

Get ready to learn by doing, connect with others, and see how your choices can help shape a better food future. Let's play!



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
1. Happy Salmon: Sustainable Food Edition

Objective

Be the **first player to get rid of all 5 cards** in your hand by finding other players with matching actions and making sustainability come alive—loud, fast, and fun!

Players & Setup

- **Total Players:** 20 (Note: 2 box sets of cards are required)
- **Split into 2 teams of 10: Team A and Team B**
- Each team uses its own **identical set of 67 cards** based on the Future Green sustainability themes. That means you'll need **two full decks**—one for each team.
- The cards are **divided** among players.
- Team A will need 67 cards
- Team B will need 67 cards
- For example, if there are **20 players**, there should be 10 people in each team , each person receives **6 or 7 cards**
 - Stand in a spacious area in 2 rows or groups. Team A facing Team B



- We recommend **standing** to stay quick and mobile.



- To make it super exciting you can give prizes to the first three that come to the front and shout ‘happy salmon’.

How to Play

1. **Shuffle** your cards and hold them **face down** in one hand.
 2. On “Go!”, **flip over the top card** so only you can see it.
 3. Look around and **shout the action on your card** as loud and clearly as you can!
 - You might find yourself calling out:
 - “Access to nutrition!”
 - “Support the community!”
 - “Embracing biodiversity!”
 4. While shouting your phrase, listen for **someone else shouting the same phrase**. That’s your match!
 5. When you find a match:
 - **Touch index fingers** in a sustainability “high five,”
 - Then **discard the card** anywhere out of the way, and
 - **Flip the next card** in your deck and keep going!

Stuck on a Card?

If no one matches your card after a few tries:

- Move it to the **bottom of your deck**, reveal a new one, and try again.
 - You’ll eventually circle back to it—just keep moving!

How to Win

The **first player to discard all cards** wins!

There are **no turns**, no waiting—just full-on, fast-paced sustainability shouting and matching.

Final Tip

Be bold, be loud, and remember—this game is all about having fun **while learning how food choices shape the planet**. So, shout it like you mean it!

2. Read. Reflect. Race!

Objective

Learn to recognise sustainability actions and understand how they fit into our holistic Future Green framework by sorting them into categories.

In this energetic group challenge, players first familiarise themselves with key sustainability actions in silence—then race to place them under the right pillar and their subcategories: Procurement, Environment, or Society. Fast thinking, teamwork, and focus win the day!

Players & Setup


Players: 20 players, divided into pairs

You'll need:

- Future Green sustainability card deck (shuffled and face-down)
- Use a wall or whiteboard divided into three columns with subcategories under each.

For example (procurement):



How to Play



Phase 1: Speed Reading (Silent Warm-Up)

1. Each player takes 5 cards from the deck to read silently.
2. Spend 1 minute familiarising yourself with the sustainability actions on your cards—no discussion allowed.
3. When time is up, pass your 5 cards to the person on your left.
4. Repeat the process until everyone has seen all the cards in the deck.



Phase 2: Race to the Wall

1. Once all cards have been read, put people into pairs.
 2. The facilitator asks each pair to take an equal number of cards each. For example, if there are 20 players (10 pairs), each pair will have about 6 or 7 cards (67 cards divided by 10).
 3. On the count of 3, teams **race to place** their cards under the correct pillar and their subcategories on the wall: *Procurement, Environment, or Society*.
 4. The first team to correctly place all their cards wins the round!
 5. The team should shout *Planet Possible* when finished
 6. The facilitator (or another team) checks placements using a cheat sheet.
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Winning the Game

The **first team** to correctly sort all their cards into the right pillars wins!
You can play multiple rounds with new cards to reinforce learning or swap decks between teams for an added challenge.

Why It Works

This fast-paced, silent-to-active sequence helps participants first absorb information individually, then apply it together.
It reinforces understanding of the Future Green framework while encouraging quiet reflection, team strategy, and quick thinking.
Perfect as a warm-up or energiser before deeper sustainability discussions or workshops.

3. Picture This: Draw Your Food Future

Objective

Unleash your creativity!

In this visual storytelling game, teams turn sustainability actions into sketches. No words, no numbers—just pictures and teamwork. The goal: help your teammates guess the action while exploring how imagination can bring a better food future to life.


Players & Setup

Players: 20, divided into two teams of 10..

You'll need:

- Future Green sustainability card deck (shuffled and face-down)
 - Whiteboards, flipcharts, or large sheets of paper
 - Markers or pens
 - Timer (suggested: 60 seconds per round)


How to Play



Phase 1: Speed Reading (Silent Warm-Up)

5. Each player takes 5 cards from the deck to read silently.
 6. Spend 1 minute familiarising yourself with the sustainability actions on your cards—no discussion allowed.
 7. When time is up, pass your 5 cards to the person on your left.
 8. Repeat the process until everyone has seen all the cards in the deck.

Phase 2: Draw



1. Each team selects one player to be the drawer for the round.
 2. The drawer picks one card from the deck without showing it to anyone.
 3. Set the timer for 1 minute.
 4. The drawer begins sketching the sustainability action using only visuals—no words, letters, numbers, or gestures allowed.
 5. Teammates shout out their guesses until they identify the correct action.
 6. A correct guess within the time limit earns the team 1 point.
 7. Rotate the drawer each round so everyone gets a turn.
 8. The drawer must not use the same graphic design as the Future Green design

Winning the Game

Play until every player has drawn once, or for a set number of rounds.
The team with the **most correct guesses** at the end wins!

Why It Works

Picture This: Draw Your Food Future brings sustainability to life through visual creativity.

It helps players connect abstract ideas to real actions—engaging both their imagination and teamwork skills. Perfect for visual learners, it turns learning into laughter while reinforcing the Future Green framework in a memorable, hands-on way.
